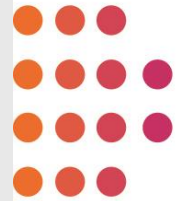

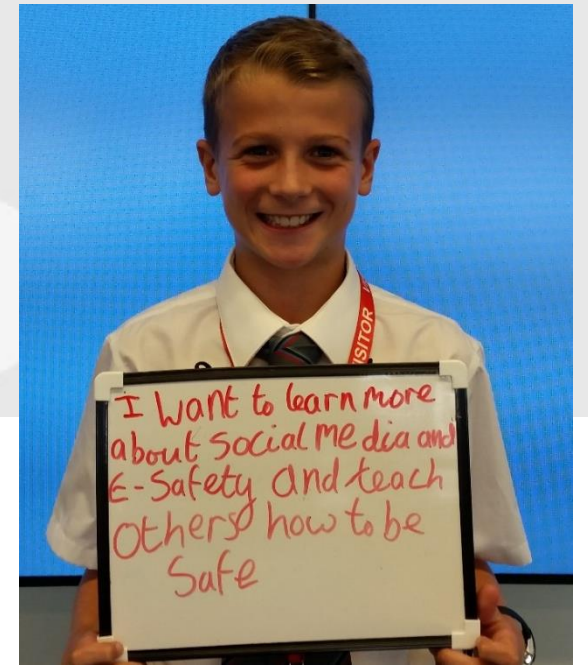

Pilot of the Childnet Digital Leaders Programme

7 secondary schools

75 digital leaders

1,400 students reached

63% The session made me feel more confident about staying safe online

75% The session was helpful

70% I will now be more careful about what I share online

82% I preferred hearing from young people rather than adults

Why is peer led important?

In the UK, excellent e-safety provision depends on active involvement and leadership of young people within the school.

Examples of this include:

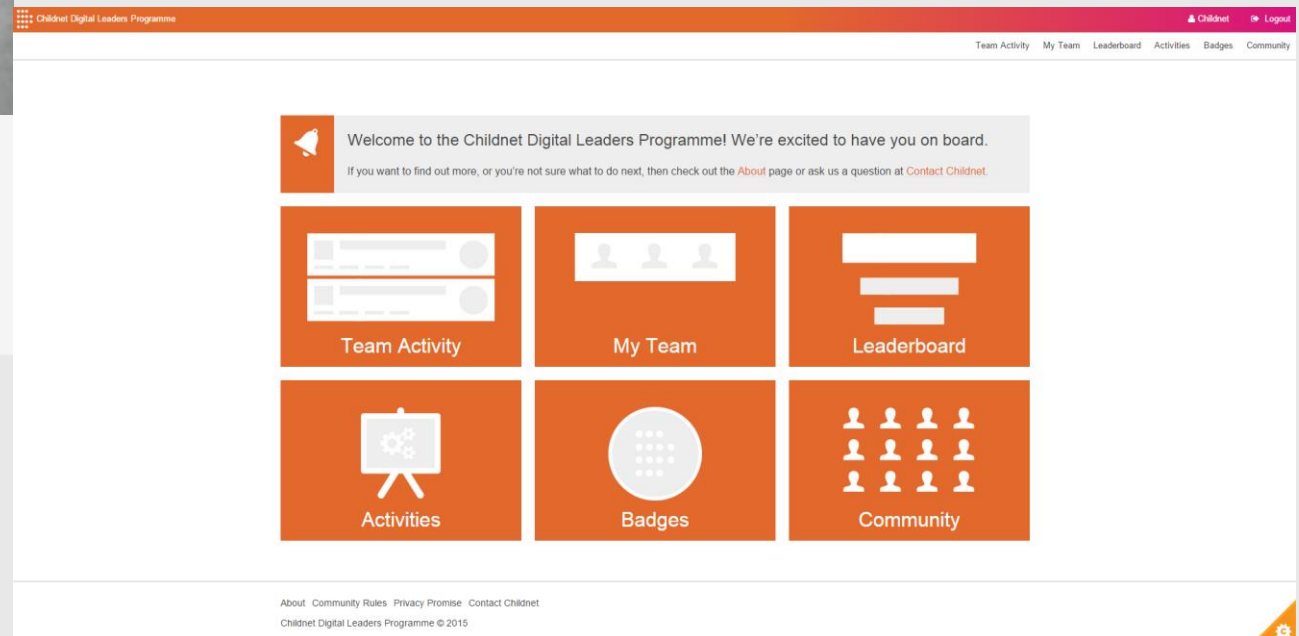
- **Contribution of pupils is valued and integrated in whole school approach to e-safety**
- **Effective use of peer mentoring in e-safety education and reporting procedures**
- **Education is relevant and engages pupils' interest**
- **Children integral to policy production**
- **Children educate parents**
